IN CONCLUSION OF THE EU-FUNDED PROJECT CREATING PUBLIC SPACES - BEST PRACTICE IN THE RE-USE OF CONFISCATED ASSETS

Turn mafia-dens into democratic community centres! - Through the EU-project Creating Public Spaces German and Italian organisations worked on models of how to strengthen local democratic culture through the re-use of assets confiscated from criminal groups. As an instrument of repression and prevention of crime this approach has been successfully used in Italy against mafias. In which way could the confiscation and re-use by civil society be helpful also in Germany to counter groups of the extreme right and other criminal organisations? During a twoday conference this will be debated by members of civil society, by lawyers, politicians and academics of different disciplines - always with the aim of developing concrete proposals.

# WSI Legal frameworks

This workshop's discussions will focus on two issues. Taking account of the civil society-recommendations to the Bundestag regarding the planned reform of the system of penal confiscation in Germany, participants will debate what a possible system of confiscation and social reuse could look like in Germany. The second discussion point will be the pros and cons of widening § 129a StGB (German penal code: criminal or terrorist organisation) to include mafia-type criminal organisations. The Italian penal code provides a definition of a mafia-type criminal organisation, could this be helpful for a potential future reform of the German penal code?

## WS II Reflections on social spaces

This workshop will center on social dynamics around spaces dominated by rightwing-extremists, with a specific regard to the concept of spaces of fear'. How can spaces of fear be described, are there differences between urban and rural areas? What role do specific buildings play in the establishment of spaces of fear? What spatial strategies do criminal Nazi groups use, sometimes leading to a veritable territorial control? These questions will be addressed together with civil society experts from Berlin-Köpenick and Dortmund-Dorstfeld, with the aim of developing concrete proposals of how to push back spaces of fear or territorial control by criminal groups.

#### WS III Cultural actions

Starting from the work of Saxony-Anhalt association of cultural youth work LKJ and the Calabrian Nemesis Cooperative, participants will discuss strategies of democratic (re-)appropriation of spaces through participatory cultural work. In their national pilot project www.dehnungsfuge.com LKJ Sachsen-Anhalt starts from buildings left without function because of economic-demographic decline. The Calabrian Cooperative Nemesis starts from buildings left without function because of the repression of criminal activity leading to confiscation. The way how the ,Dehnungsfuge' team activates social networks and stimulates them through cultural actions will be compared with the situation in Calabria. What cultural processes, what artistic forms result from such work? And how should they be supported?
